Text: Calculus Concepts and Contexts by James Stewart

Coverage: We will cover chapters 10, 11, 12 and a little of 13 as time permits.

Prerequisite: MA 126 (Calculus II). The prerequisite is strictly enforced in this course. If you

Grading: There will be two in-class tests, each counting as 25% of the course grade.

The final exam will be cumulative, and will count as 35% of the course grade. The remaining 15% of the grade will be derived from short quizzes, homework sets, and lab assignments after the lowest quiz/homework/lab grade is dropped. There are no make-up tests or quizzes, and late homework is not accepted. If you miss a test, a grade for that test will be extrapolated from the part of the final exam that covers the missed test. (Note: You cannot choose to miss a test after you have received the test in class.) Unless otherwise announced, the cut-off points for the letter grades A, B, C and D are 90%, 80%,

70% and 60%, respectively.
